HASANZ WEBINAR

In 2019, *Building the Professions* found that New Zealand needed more health and safety professionals. It set a workforce growth target of 4% a year.

HASANZ has now completed new research to see what happened next - and whether workforce capacity and capability are still holding back health and safety outcomes.

The short version: the workforce grew faster than projected, by around 6% a year. On the numbers, the gap has largely closed in some disciplines.

That raises a harder question: if we have the people, why haven't outcomes improved further?

To explore this, HASANZ conducted a sector-wide survey, interviewed stakeholders across the disciplines, analysed Integrated Data Infrastructure workforce data, and developed a purpose-built impact model.

HASANZ deliberately took a devil's advocate approach. Instead of assuming that more capability building was the answer, it was tested whether it would genuinely improve outcomes.
